Principal's Message

SEXUALITY

As part of our health curriculum this term your child will be taught lessons relating to human development, sexuality and relationships. This health unit has been written based on the Sexuality Education document. Our lessons will be supported by Ingrid Kemp - Life Education Educator.

The programme gives students opportunities to talk about values and feelings and to practise communication and assertiveness skills. They will learn about:

1. Relationships and peer pressure
2. Pubertal change
3. Human reproduction
4. How social messages (stereotypes) can affect feelings of self-worth

Health Education is a part of the New Zealand Curriculum, however, Sexuality Education is taught with parental consent. Parents/caregivers may request in writing that their child is withdrawn from specific lessons using the 'Sexuality Education Response' slip that came home last term. If you are happy for your child to attend all lessons there is no need to respond.

Many parents have reported that their child's involvement in the programme has provided opportunities for follow-up discussion at home. Used in this way the school programme can reinforce the parent's role as first educators.

Your health system is sharing more, to provide better, safer care

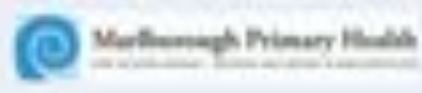
HealthOne
