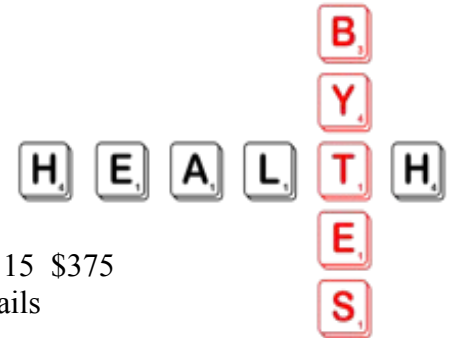

Health Bytes: Road Safety

Speed around schools is a major public health and road safety issue. The faster you go, the less time you have to react and the longer it takes to stop. Children are most at risk, especially in the morning and afternoon when they're walking and cycling to and from school. Pedestrian casualties (deaths, serious and minor injuries) occur the most at school peak times (7 - 9am and 2 - 4pm). Source – NZTA Crash Analysis System:
