NATIONAL STANDARDS 2017

We begin the school year guided by achievement 'baselines' in Reading, Writing and Maths from the student's previous teacher or school to determine where they are learning in relation to the National Standards. Using this data we formulate targets and a plan of action, our charter, to accelerate students who are underachieving. If you want assistance with your son or daughter's learning please contact their teacher, you do not have to wait for student/parent/teacher conferences. You can do this throughout the year at a mutually agreed time. My experience suggests, the 'tighter' the relationship between student, parent and teacher the greater the likelihood of success.

Year 7's (at or above the National Standard)

READING: 79%
 WRITING: 68%
 MATHEMATICS: 69%

Year 8's (at or above the National Standard)

READING: 76%
 WRITING: 69%
 MATHEMATICS: 64%

CHARTER TARGETS:

MATHEMATICS: All male students (66) and Maori female students (8) who are just below the National Standard will make accelerated progress relative to the Mathematics standard by the end of 2017. Maori students (29) below the National Standard will be our priority (male and female).

WRITING: All males (79) who are just below the National Standard will make accelerated progress relative to the Writing standard by the end of 2017. Maori males (25) below the National Standard will be our priority.
